2022: A YEAR OF ACHIEVEMENTS

We were blessed with an abundance of awards and opportunities in 2022. Our facility and staff were recognized for their excellence by our local community, government, and state officials.

The DuBois Chamber of Commerce selected Christ the King Manor as its recipient of the Community Cup, which recognized our efforts to raise \$21,200 for local organizations during our 50th Anniversary celebrations in 2021.



We were also nominated for and won the Governor's Achievement Award for our dedication to the development and education of our local workforce. Our HR Generalist Stephanie Stahlman (pictured below) accepted the award on our behalf with PA Workforce Solutions. Our LPN Apprenticeship Program is the first and only such program in the state of Pennsylvania and allows us to grow our nursing staff from within. We strive to keep the best and brightest minds in our community by offering continued education and opportunities for career growth.

On March 4, our leadership welcomed U.S. Congressman Glen "GT" Thompson to tour our facility and hear about the challenges facing our industry. Representing Pennsylvania's 15th District since 2019, Thompson was more than generous with his time and attentiveness to our leadership. Thompson spoke at length with our CEO and Chief Administrator Paula Felton-Werner, COO Ed Andrulonis, and members of our board of directors among others. If we are to enact change in our industry, it starts with the dedication of those who represent us. We would like to again thank Congressman Thompson for his time and support.



FINANCIAL AID SEMINAR



You can never be too prepared when it comes to finances and aging, so on April 9, we hosted our first educational seminar for the community, entitled Aging Parents & Senior Financial Planning Seminar. Our staff, residents, and members of the community at large came together in our Community Center to hear experts explain the complexities of financial awareness.

Christ the King Manor's own Heather Shaffer, manager of the Business Office, gave a presentation about our facility and services. She detailed the differences in payment based on the services in question, namely Personal Care, Skilled Nursing, Independent Living, and Home Support. For those curious about the differences between Medicare, Medicaid, and Private Pay, this seminar provided necessary information. Shaffer provided a helpful reminder to those planning for their parents to plan ahead. It's better to make plans and get informed long before a loved one needs care. Talk with your loved ones or research for yourself to see which facilities, levels of care, and methods of payment fit your circumstances.

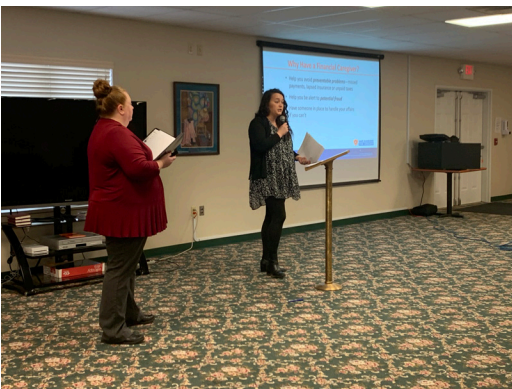

Joining us from outside the facility were Jeff Baronick of Baronick Funeral Home & Crematorium, Inc., Pati Dasta, VP/Manager of First Commonwealth Bank, and Adrianne Peters-Sipes of Compass Estate Planning and Elder Law.

Baronick also stressed the importance of planning long before his services are required. He laid out the costs, options, and payment options for a funeral, and gave a breakdown of the benefits of preplanning. Dasta informed the group about selecting a financial caregiver, including the traits and knowledge one should have to become one. In some unfortunate situations, caregivers can exploit those in their care, so she highlighted signs of financial abuse and mistreatment. Peters-Sipes gave a full explanation of power of attorney, costs of care, and veteran's benefits.

As an organization, we were proud to host the seminar for all that attended. We plan to hold more seminars in the future, so anyone seeking education about finances, aging, or the industry of long-term care is encouraged to attend. We would like to thank our experts, both internal and external, for providing the attendees with an invaluable base of knowledge for the care of themselves and their loved ones.

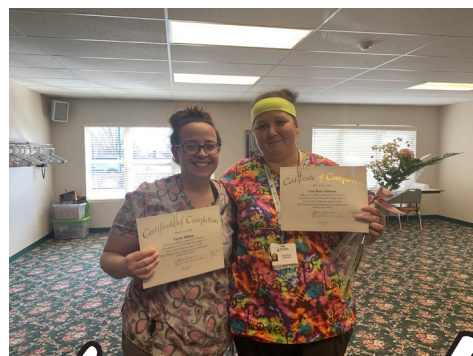

After schooling in mechanical engineering at Penn State University and studying to work in the aerospace industry at the University of California - Los Angeles, Roger tested rockets for the military while stationed in Huntsville, Alabama. This program would become the birthplace of the American space program.

Upon returning to Western Pennsylvania, Roger became partner and president of Alpha Sintered Metals Inc. for 32 years until his retirement in 2004. Later in his life, Roger came to Christ the King Manor until his passing in 2019.

His family, including our board member Jane Bryndel, made an enormously generous donation to the Manor in 2022 to improve the front entrance and patio area. 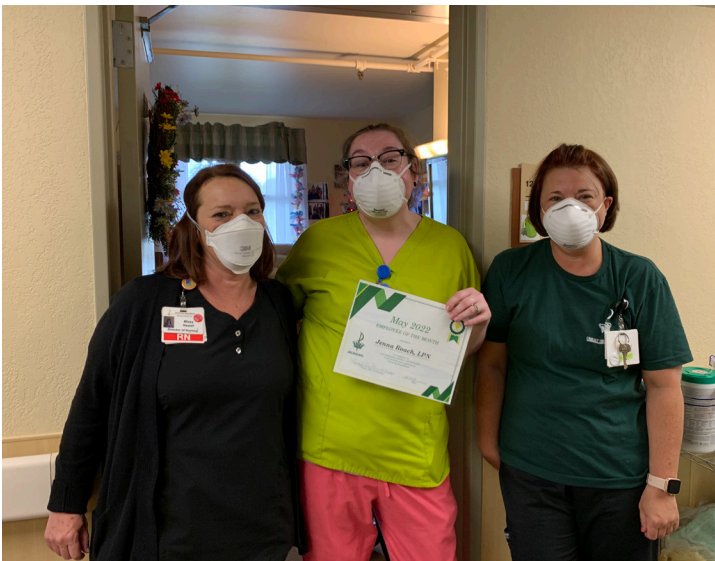

EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH!

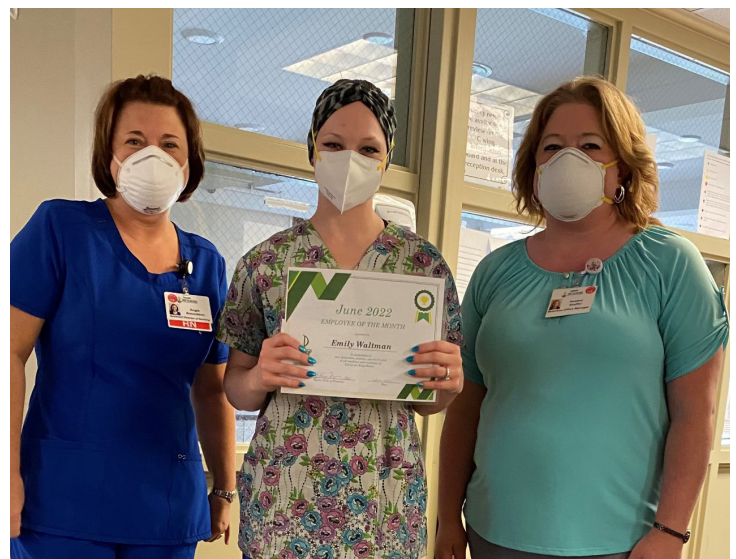

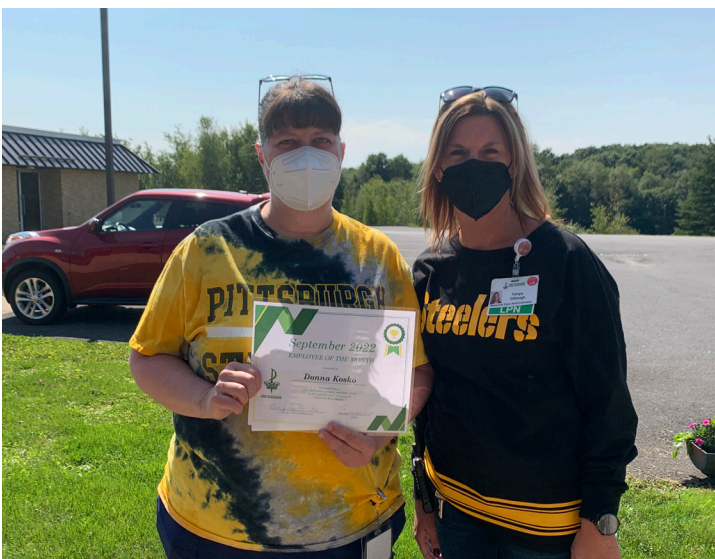


EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH!

CHRISTMAS TIME

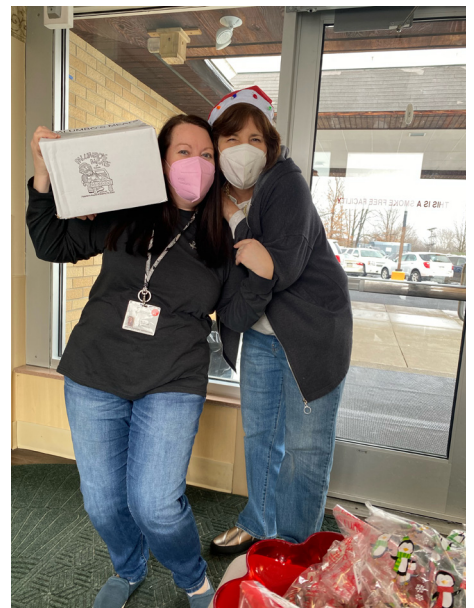
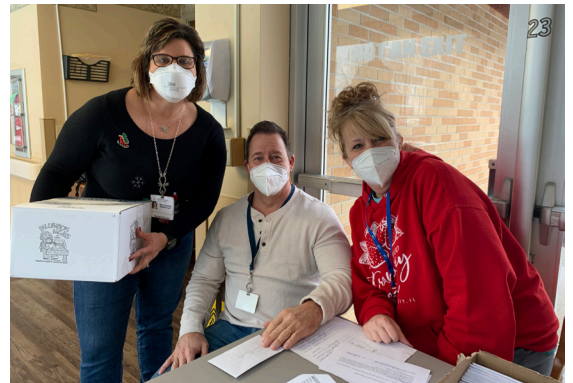
