OUR HISTORY

Christ the King Manor shines atop more than 120 acres of beautiful countryside in DuBois, Pennsylvania. As a service of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Erie, we strive to provide the finest in Christian health care while preserving the dignity and independence of our residents. We opened our doors to our first resident in 1971. Exiting our 50th year proudly serving the DuBois area, our mission is to provide a continuum of care through the healing mission of Jesus Christ, empowering those we serve to live full and dignified lives.

Today, we operate as Christ the King Manor, Inc. with five separate divisions: Skilled Nursing, Personal Care, The Cottages, The Apartments, and Christ the King at Home, our home support division. We serve more than 400 families in the area as we strive to be the best place to live and work.

In 2020, we were the seventh largest employer in Clearfield County. Despite the difficulties presented by the pandemic, we continue to bring in some of the best and brightest staff in the area to compliment a talented and tenured base of loyal employees.

Our slogan for the year was “50 Years, Celebrating by Giving”. Throughout 2021, we fundraised and donated to 12 worthwhile causes which we believe exemplify our mission. Our goal was to give back within the community, so we partnered with the following organizations to raise more than \$21,200.00.

This year was also a chance for our employees and the community to reflect on our history at Christ the King Manor. Over the last many years, Christ the King Manor has become a memorable place for many current residents, previous residents, and their families. During our 50th Anniversary Celebration, we took a look back on our proud history serving the community.

In 1971, we opened with 100 nursing beds. Within 15 years, 120 beds were added between D-Wing and our Personal Care Wing. At the turn of the century, we obtained a license as a Continuing Care Retirement Community, began Home Support Services, built our Chapel, Community Center, Mary, Mother of Hope, Memory Support Unit, and Short-Term Rehab Unit and Therapy Suite. In the last decade, we've further expanded with interior renovations, an Activities Center, Beauty Shop, two new apartment buildings, and finished our 54th cottage. Most recently, we purchased 20 acres on Central Christian Drive for future projects.

In recognizing all we have done for the community that has welcomed and supported us over the past 50 years, we acknowledge the need to always improve for our community, residents, and employees. Christ the King Manor is committed to the future of DuBois and the surrounding areas. We have worked and will continue to work with local schools to train the next bright minds and keep them local. We can only achieve the highest standards of care we set for ourselves if we continue to employ the finest workers and offer opportunities for career growth and education.

Thank you to our residents, staff, leadership, board of directors, and community for a special first 50 years. Through ups and downs, highs and lows, your support and continued faith have been constants in our prosperity. Here's to 50 years and to many more to come.



Happy Veterans Day!


